#### **BIOGRAPHIES, SPEAKERS**



Armando Sanchez is a Catch the Next, Ascender Program Alum from Austin Community College (ACC). While a student at ACC, he began with an interest in Automotive Technology. A year later, he shifted his focus to government after meeting an individual who opened his eyes to a different world. With the additional support of two professors who taught state and federal government, Armando then earned the opportunity to intern at the Texas House of Representatives, where he continued his interest in government by participating in the Diplomats as the Secretary of the club at ACC, discussing international issues. He began the program in 2017 and graduated with an Associate of Arts in General Studies in December 2019.

In January 2020, he transferred to Texas State University at San Marcos, where he pursued a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science, with a minor in Communication Studies, and graduated in August 2021. During his undergraduate journey, he developed skills that enabled him to adapt to different political settings, articulate his concerns, and address current issues. The skills he developed during his time at Texas State have helped him effectively advocate for and research pertinent information. He has been able to draw upon these skills while being interviewed several times to discuss the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) and other issues faced by undocumented individuals in Texas. Throughout these interviews, he was also allowed to present his concerns about the Supreme Court ruling on DACA, discuss Texas House Bill 1486, and its impact on the eligibility of undocumented students for in-state tuition. Armando is a first-generation DACAmented student from Ixtapan de la Sal, Mexico.

Armando received a Master of Arts in Political Science at Texas State University, where he worked as a Graduate Assistant. Despite his challenging childhood, Armando is proud of his accomplishments and acknowledges the support he receives. He looks forward to what the future has in store for him, doing his best to change the world while making his parents proud of all the sacrifices they have made for him and giving him the world. Reminding him to keep his head up, no matter how cruel the world may be. Armando is the Operations Manager for Catch the Next, Inc.



**Daniel Garcia** has over eight years of experience in marketing, including two years as an account manager at one of Texas's most prestigious digital marketing firms. Dr. Yolanda Padilla is the Clara Pope Willoughby Centennial Professor and Associate Dean for Undergraduate Programs at the University of Texas at Austin's Steve Hicks School of Social Work. Dr. Padilla attended Texas Southmost College in Brownsville, her hometown. She transferred to the University of Texas, where she completed undergraduate and master's degrees in social work and psychology. Dr. Padilla completed a joint Ph.D. in sociology and social work at the University of Michigan and was appointed assistant professor at UT immediately following. Her areas of teaching at the graduate and undergraduate levels are social problems and social welfare policy analysis, social welfare programs, social work practice with communities and organizations, and introduction to social work practice. She developed two new courses

incorporated into the school's curriculum, one providing specialized training in poverty policy analysis and another on policy and practice issues in social work with gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender populations.



Jessika L. Wysinger, M.Ed - Senior Program Coordinator of Transfer Admissions: Jessika Wysinger is the Senior Program Coordinator for Transfer Admissions at The University of Texas at Austin, where she plays a pivotal role in connecting prospective transfer students from various pipelines to the resources they need for a seamless transfer experience. Jessika is passionate about supporting Texas students as they seek admission to the flagship university, helping them navigate the admissions process and ensuring their success at the University of Texas at Austin. Before her current role, Jessika worked as an Admissions Counselor in Freshman

Admissions in Houston, where she focused on recruiting local students and guiding them through the application process to UT Austin. A proud Texas Ex (a graduate of UT Austin, % 2019), Jessika holds a Master's in Enrollment Management and Policy from the University of Southern California. Michael K. Washington – Associate Director of Transfer Admissions: Mike Washington is an Associate Director within the Office of Admissions at the University of Texas at Austin. He oversees a broad range of responsibilities, primarily focusing on Transfer Decisions, Transfer Policies, the oversight of Transfer Partnerships, and the Articulation of transferable coursework. With nearly five decades of service at UT Austin, he began his career in 1978 as an Admissions Counselor. In 1981, he accepted a position to oversee the Registration Supervision and Certification units within the Office of the Registrar. After serving in that capacity for eight years, he assumed a new role as an Academic Advisor for Student-Athletes

in the Office of Intercollegiate Athletics. His final career move was back to the Office of Admissions in 1993. In his current role, Mike has helped establish numerous policies and procedures that have advanced the University of Texas at Austin. He has become an advocate for higher education, serving on numerous committees, task forces, and boards (at UT, in Texas, and beyond). He serves as Chairman of the Board of Regents at his undergraduate alma mater (Texas Lutheran University). Mike was a first-generation college student (from Austin) who attended TLU on a football scholarship. He has promoted higher educational opportunities after completing a successful collegiate career (and a short stint in

professional sports and high school teaching/coaching). Of which the last 30-plus years have been predominantly focused on advancing Transfer Students.



**Dr. Cierra Campbell-Bridges** – Director of Transfer Admissions: Dr. Cierra Campbell-Bridges is the Director of Transfer Admissions within the Office of Admissions at The University of Texas at Austin and has served this institution professionally for over a decade. Hailing from Richmond, Texas, Cierra is married to her UT sweetheart (Jay) and is the mother of two future Longhorn ladies (Cassidy & Caylee). She leads transfer recruitment and is instrumental in increasing the efficiency of the transfer admissions process. Cierra supports prospective students and their families throughout the transfer application process, as well as university

administrators on and off campus, with course transfer eligibility and admission requirements. Cierra leads the Centralized Internal Transfer team and ensures that support is available to multiple stakeholders across the university and beyond. **Michael Guinn** has successfully fused the art of spoken word with social awareness, making him one of the most sought-after motivational speakers, specializing in creating social awareness and empowering youth. He is also the founder of the PSI Certified Fort Worth National Poetry Slams and the Fort Worth Write National Youth Poetry Team. He is internationally renowned as one of the world's hardest-working performance poets, emcees, coordinators, poetry slam masters, and promoters of youth and adult Spoken Word events. Guinn is also the co-founder of the NATIONAL POETRY AWARDS, the North Texas Spoken Word

Awards, and the Texas Spoken Word Awards, and has continued to host several ongoing weekly, monthly, and annual poetry open mics for the past 16 years. He has appeared, featured, judged, hosted, facilitated workshops, and helped organize events for the Austin International Poetry Festival, the Valley International Poetry Festival, the Arkansas Grand Slam, and the World Poetry Slam Championships. Guinn's list of stellar accomplishments includes Two National slam finals appearances, 5-timeNational Poetry Slam Semi-finalists, Toronto International Slam Co Champ, 5 Time Fort Worth Grand Slam Champ, 13-time NPS Slam Poet, 4-time Austin International Poetry Slam Champion, Great Plains Pile Up Slam Champ, Last Poet Standing Slam Champ and several literary awards including judge for the poetry category for the 2016 NAACP Image Awards. He has been involved in two movie productions and an online web series called Battle Lines. He holds a master's degree in social work.



Dr. Maria Martha Chavez-Brummel is the CEO of CTN and a sociologist specializing in the research, implementation, and evaluation of social policy. She earned her bachelor's degrees in journalism, psychology, and Spanish literature from Kansas State University. Additionally, she holds a master's degree in education, with a focus on curriculum and instruction, as well as a Master of Philosophy and a Doctor of Philosophy from Yale University.

While at Kansas State, Dr. Chavez created the Minority Admissions Program. She has served as Assistant Dean at Yale College and as a faculty member there. During her time at Yale, she established the Asian/Chicano-Native American Cultural Center. She developed the Chicano

Boricua Studies program (which has since evolved into the American Studies, Race, Ethnicity, and Migration major). She holds a lifetime Honorary faculty status for the Yale Elihu Society and is part of the President's World Leaders Group. For the City of New Haven, Chavez founded the LULAC Head Start Program and the construction of the Latino Youth Center. Additionally, Dr. Chavez worked at Save the Children Federation as the Associate Vice President of U.S. Programs and Global Marketing Team. She was the principal investigator for the report titled "America's Forgotten Children," which examined the 101 poorest rural areas in America. As part of the America's Forgotten Children Campaign, she established six community learning centers in California's Central Valley. Dr. Chavez also collaborated with Public Agenda—a research and engagement organization—as a national partner in the Achieving the Dream Initiative, serving as a Research and Engagement Coach and a member of the Knowledge Development Working Group.



Diana Gorostieta Martinez, a member of the Catch the Next Board, serves as the Coordinator for the Ascender program at Austin Community College (ACC). She promotes student engagement and retention by coordinating cultural and educational events, ensuring positive relationships between students and mentors. As an alumna of the Ascender program, Diana earned an Associate's Degree in Business Administration before transferring to Texas State University, where she obtained a Bachelor of Science in Marketing and, in 2023, completed her Master's Degree in Business Administration with a concentration in International Business. dreamer, Diana is passionate about inspiring others, like herself, to pursue their educational aspirations.

Sandra earned her

associate degree in 2020, then transferred to The University of Texas at Austin, graduating in 2022 with a Bachelor's in Social Work. Today, she serves as a Family Self-Sufficiency Coach with the Housing Authority of the City of Austin, helping others set meaningful goals and find strength in their own stories. She also works with Hospice Austin as a GIFT Clinical Presenter, where she leads compassionate conversations around end-of-life care.

In addition to her work in public service, Sandra is a published poet and the co-founder of Armonía, a Latin heritage home-wellness brand she created with her son. Together, they are creating a space where scent, story, and cultural memory converge to redefine what luxury and legacy can mean. Sandra's journey is not about perfection or arrival. 
